ELIGIBLITY AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR SEALING & EXPUNGEMENT OF ADULT CRIMINAL RECORDS

The Clerk of Courts, Common Pleas Court, and Adult Probation Department personnel are not permitted to answer legal questions. Please contact an attorney if you need clarification.

WHEN CAN YOU FILE TO SEAL A CRIME? (R.C. § 2953.32)

Felony: If you were convicted of a fourth or fifth degree felony, you must wait one (1) year after your final discharge from probation and/or jail. If you were convicted of not more than two third degree felonies, you must wait three (3) years after your final discharge from probation and/or jail. If you were convicted of felony theft in office, you must wait seven (7) years after your final discharge from probation and/or jail.

Misdemeanor/Minor Misdemeanor: If you were convicted of a misdemeanor, you must wait one (1) year after your final discharge from probation and/or jail. If you were convicted of a minor misdemeanor, you must wait six (6) months after your final discharge from probation and/or jail.

Not Guilty Verdict, Dismissal, Diversion, or Intervention in Lieu of Conviction: You may qualify to have your record sealed after a *not guilty finding* or *dismissal of proceeding* (as in Hancock County's Pre-Trial Diversion program or Intervention in Lieu of Conviction). You may file your application at any time after the finding of not guilty or the dismissal of the complaint or indictment.

No Bill: If the prosecutor took your case to the grand jury, and the grand jury decides that there is not enough evidence to indict you, then your case was what is called a "no bill." You must wait two (2) years after the "no bill" is recorded.

WHEN CAN YOU FILE TO EXPUNGE A CRIME? (R.C. § 2953.32)

Minor Misdemeanor: After the expiration of 6 months for a minor misdemeanor after the offender's final discharge.

Misdemeanor: After the expiration of one (1) year after the offender's final discharge.

Felonies: If the offense is a **felony**, at the expiration of ten (10) years after the time specified to permit an application for sealing of that felony offense.

Victims of Human Trafficking: May file to expunge at any time for violations of Revised Code sections 2907.24, 2907.241, or 2907.25 other than a record of conviction for violations of Revised Code sections 2903.01, 2903.02, or 2907.02.

DOES YOUR CRIME QUALIFY?

The law is very clear that the following convictions can **never** be sealed or expunged, even if it is your only conviction.

- Any **first or second** degree felony;
- If you were convicted of more than two **third** degree felonies;

- Any offense with a mandatory prison term;
- Any offense under R.C. Chapter 4506 (OVI)
- R.C. Chapters 4507, 4510, 4511, or 4559 (Traffic) except in accordance with R.C. § 2953.61
- Any **offense of violence** which means:

- Pandering obscenity involving a minor
- Pandering sexually oriented matter involving a minor
- Also any felony or misdemeanor of which the victim was less than thirteen years of age, (except when the conviction is under 2919.21 Nonsupport or Contributing to Nonsupport of Dependants)

ARE YOU AN ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUAL?

If you are sealing a conviction:

If there are criminal proceedings <u>currently</u> pending against you, you are INELIGIBLE to seal your conviction at this time.

The law also clarifies who is individually eligible. You are ELIGIBLE if any of the following apply:

- If all of your offenses are fourth or fifth degree felonies, or misdemeanors:
- If you have no more than two (2) third degree felonies

If you are sealing a not guilty verdict, dismissal, or no bill:

You are eligible to file as soon as the applicable time limit has passed as outlined above.

IF YOU THINK YOU ARE ELIGIBLE:

If you believe you are eligible to file for Sealing of Criminal Records, you will need to do the following:

- 1. You must complete the applicable four-page Application for Sealing of Criminal Records which can be found at the bottom of this document and in the following areas:
 - a. The Hancock County Law Library located on the Fourth Floor of the Hancock County Courthouse at 300 South Main Street, Findlay, Ohio.
 - b. The Hancock County Adult Probation Department located at 514 South Main Street, Suite A, Findlay, Ohio 45840.
 - i. <u>Conviction:</u> If you were convicted of your crime; please select the **Application** for Sealing or Expungement of Conviction. (See below).
 - ii. <u>Diversion/Intervention in Lieu of Conviction/Dismissal/No Bill:</u> If you were a non-convicted case, please select the **Application for Sealing of Criminal Records**. (See below).
- 2. This Motion must be filed with the Hancock County Clerk of Courts Office located in the Hancock County Courthouse at 300 South Main Street, Findlay, Ohio 45840.
- 3. Your attorney will do this for you or you can do it yourself (called a *pro se* motion), if you do not have an attorney. Please be sure you are eligible under the law before you file this motion.
- 4. The filing fee is fifty dollars (\$50.00).
- 5. The Court will set your case for hearing and refer it to the Hancock County Adult Probation Department for an investigation.
- 6. The Adult Probation Department will contact you and ask you to provide information. This information must be returned promptly.
- 7. If your crime was related to child support, the Adult Probation Department will investigate to inquire about your compliance with any child support order.
- 8. A complete report will be submitted to the Court before your hearing date and time.

THE COURT MUST DETERMINE THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. If you are eligible based on the above information;
- 2. You have been rehabilitated to the satisfaction of the Court; and
- 3. Your interests in sealing your record must outweigh any legitimate needs of the government to maintain those records.
